Global Youth Collaboration: A Dream, and a Shared Goal

Students from Eisenberg and Schmölln in Germany connected with peers in Sialkot, Pakistan, to discuss Sustainable Development. Their reflections were meant to become a song with a local musician, but political unrest halted the project. Later, hope was rekindled when a Pakistani artist performed in Europe and helped revive the idea. Together, they produced a music CD inspired by the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), especially SDG 8 — promoting decent work and economic growth. A key takeaway from their dialogue was that 1 in 4 youth are not in education or employment, with young women being most affected, highlighting the need for global partnerships.

Step 1: 17 Goals – 17 Songs

Each team chose one sustainability goal. They had online discussions and shared ideas to understand the issue. Then, together, they wrote songs that explain the goal in a simple and musical way.

17 goals – 17 teams – 17 songs.




Step 2: Songs Become Music Videos

Next, these songs were turned into music videos. Each country added its culture, traditions, and colorful visuals to the videos. This made the songs come alive and helped show the beauty of our global teamwork.

Step 3: Drawings by Children

The music and teamwork inspired children to create drawings. They used colours and shapes to express what they had learned and felt.

These drawings came from deep conversations, new ideas, and global friendships.

Step 4: From Drawings to Rhymes

These drawings and ideas inspired Indian Children's writer Suvasri De, who is also a partner of Global Social India.

She wrote 17 nursery rhyme books, one for each goal, using the drawings made by Children from around the world.

Suvasri believes that today's Children need rhymes that talk about real problems in today's world, and real ways to solve them.



7. Dream Job Parade


March along the dream job street,

Jobs will come, your future's bright!




10. Jobs are Not Just Big and Loud


26. Jobs for all

We can live with love and care.




28. Let's not Waste

I'll build a future big and bright.




31. Rule for Every Day

PAKHORA school project on Nanga Parbat (Pakistan)

In 2024, support was extended to the remote village school in Pakhora, located in the Jall Valley at the foot of Nanga Parbat, Pakistan, through Michael Beek and Ameer Ullah of the Children Education Foundation & Charity Diamer.

The focus was on girls' education, with 55 school uniforms produced and four Labdoo laptops loaded with educational software delivered.

Barnabas Children's Center






